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CALL FOR PAPERS

The 2021 Middle States Division AAG Meeting will be held at Rutgers University on Friday October 29 and Saturday October 30



Rutgers University extends a warm welcome to our campus in New Brunswick, NJ. The meeting will be held in the Rutgers University Inn & Conference Center on Cook Campus. (Note, this is a slight change of venue from that previously announced).

The 2021 meeting will consist of two days of paper and poster sessions. Friday will include paper and poster sessions, dinner, and Geography Bowl. On Saturday, a morning of sessions will be followed by a buffet luncheon, plenary, a brief Middle States Division business meeting, and student awards.

CALL FOR PAPERS, POSTERS, PANELS

Paper Sessions are typically 60-80 minutes long and consist of three or four presentations of 20 minutes each. Papers on all topics of geographic nature are welcome. Concurrent paper sessions will be held on Friday, October 29 and Saturday, October 30. Consult competition guidelines under the Student Competition tab on the webpage for guidance. Each room is equipped with a computer, digital projector and screen.

Poster Sessions will be held on both Friday and Saturday. Poster dimensions must be as least 36 inches in height and 48 inches in width (36"h x 48" w) but cannot exceed 48" high and 60" wide. Consult competition guidelines under the Student Competition tab on the webpage for guidance. Poster mounting boards and easels will be available.

Panel/Roundtable Sessions are welcome. Panel discussion sessions typically consist of three to four panelists and are organized around a theme. Roundtable discussion sessions are 'open forma "where the chair of the round table facilitates a discussion among all attendees focusing on a theme or issue. Students are welcome to organize both panel and roundtable sessions. A limited number of panels can be accommodated. Submitting Abstracts

Abstracts for papers, posters, and panels must be submitted during the online registration process AND to middlestatesmeeting2021@aag.org

The paper title and abstract should not exceed a total of 250 words. Compose your abstract in Microsoft Word, proofread and edit it, and copy-and-paste into the appropriate location during registration. Your submission will NOT be proofread or edited and will be published in the program as submitted. All abstract submissions for paper, posters, and panels are due by **October 10**.

Registration and Abstract Submission

Conference registration is online this year at the AAG portal <u>MSAAG 2021 Registration</u>. The AAG portal is under construction so registration and abstract submission will begin on September 1. MSAAG will send a reminder to all our membership once the abstract and registration AAG submission portal has opened.

Please check in at the lobby of the University Inn and Conference Center for the conference. Registration will start at 12 noon on Friday October 29th and 8 AM on Saturday October 30th. Participants who register for the conference by October 1 will receive an early bird discount.

**Registrations made after 21 October may not include meals, unless there is space available, since catering requires notice by that date. Walk-in tickets purchased after 21 October allow you to participate as a spectator and match "after October 1" prices. To make a presentation during this conference you must register online and submit an abstract.

Meet Our New Regional Councilor

We are pleased to announce that Steven Schnell has been elected as our Regional Councilor, and will be serving from July 1, 2021 through June 30, 2024. Steven Schnell is a Professor in the Department of Geography at Kutztown University of Pennsylvania, where he has been since 2002. He is a broadly trained cultural geographer who has published on a range of topics -- community supported agriculture, place in comics and graphic novels, ethnic identity and place, and neo-localism. From 2005-2007, he served as Secretary, Vice-President, and President of the Middle States Division of the AAG, and organized the 2007 MSAAG annual meeting. Since 2017, he has been editor of the *Journal of Cultural Geography*, and before that, he was editor of *The Geographical Bulletin*, Gamma Theta Upsilon's peer-reviewed journal for student research in geography.

Call for Graduate and Undergraduate Student Papers and Posters

STUDENT PAPER & POSTER COMPETITION

2021 Annual Meeting Middle States Division of the American Association of Geographers Rutgers University, Piscataway, NJ October 29-30, 2021

Middle States Division AAG encourages all graduate and undergraduate students to submit and present research papers to the Student Paper Competition of the MSAAG annual conference. The graduate and undergraduate paper competitions both have a first prize of \$1000 (provided by AAG to fund the awardees' registration and travel costs to the AAG Annual Meeting). The graduate paper second prize is \$300 and the third prize \$150. The undergraduate paper competition has a second prize of \$150 and a third prize of \$50. There is also a Student Poster Competition with graduate and undergraduate divisions with first prizes of \$200, second prizes of \$100 and third prizes of \$50. There is a Rob Mason Poster award for High School students of \$50 named after our past Regional Councilor Dr. Robert Mason from Temple University who passed away in 2017. He served MSAAG as President, Vice President, Secretary and Treasurer of the Division, as well as Regional Councilor.

Student status is as of May 1, 2021. Please note your status (Graduate/Undergraduate) on your abstract and paper submission. Registration fees are refunded after the conference for students both submitting the completed paper by the October 15 deadline AND presenting the paper at the conference. Completed papers must follow the *Middle States Geographer* guidelines and can be no longer than 10 pages, single spaced, 10 point Times Roman font, including all figures, tables, endnotes, and references. Further details on the guidelines are specified at the web site at msaag.aag.org. Students must have a faculty advisor certify their entry for Paper and Poster Competitions and use the guidelines and rubrics for judging on the website under the tab Student Competitions Submit this with your entry. You could win a \$300 stipend to support your participation as a MSAG team member at the 2022 AAG meeting in NYC! You can build a team beforehand (5-6 people) or sign up at the meeting to be placed on a team. The top six highest-scoring students will be invited to represent MSAAG at the World Geography Bowl at the AAG annual meeting in New York City in April 2022. Students who represent MSAAG will receive \$300 as partial funding support. Scholarship for Student Geographer from Puerto Rico or Jamaica

The Executive Board has established a \$500 scholarship to encourage participation of a student geographer from Puerto Rico at the Divisional meeting each year. Applicants should send their scholarship application of no more than 250 words to **Nate Gabriel** at <u>nate.gabriel@rutgers.edu</u> by **September 1** and should be nominated by a faculty mentor. Applicants should outline briefly their academic/research background and career goals and how participation in this meeting will assist in meeting these goals. A nomination letter from faculty mentor should accompany the student application. The awardee will receive \$500 in funding for use towards the awardee's travel, meals and lodging costs for the Middle States Division Annual Meeting. The registration fees for the scholarship awardee will also be waived.

Middle States Geographer

The *Middle States Geographer* is the official academic journal of the Middle States Division of the American Association of Geographers. The journal is published annually and includes papers from external submissions and the division Annual Meeting. The Middle States Geographer contains papers authored by both faculty and students (with peer-review by at least two reviewers) and covers a wide range of topics. All Journal Volumes are freely available from the **website**. We invite all who present papers at the annual Fall MSDAAG meetings to submit a manuscript for publication in the next issue of the *Middle States Geographer*, although manuscripts from all researchers are welcome year-round.

Students presenting papers should consider submitting their paper for publication in the journal (and faculty co-authors may be included after the student award competition has occurred). The *Middle States Geographer* is entirely an online journal. Articles from 1968 (Volume 8) through 2019 (Volume 52) may be viewed at the journal website. The 2020 issue (Volume 53) will be available soon. The online format of the journal widely increases accessibility to readers and exposure for authors, and color graphics are possible at no cost to authors.

Call for Nominations for MSAAG Officers

Please consider joining the leadership of MSAAG. The Executive Board has two meetings a year, one a conference call in the spring and one at the annual fall meeting. We are soliciting nominations for Secretary and Vice President. The Secretary serves a one-year term beginning January 2022. The Secretary takes minutes at division meetings, and organizes and judges the student paper competition at the fall meeting. The Secretary may run for Vice President the following year. The Vice President position is a three-year commitment. After serving as Vice President, the person assumes the role of President and then past President, serving a total of three years to maintain organizational continuity.
