Fall 2009 Meeting Report – SUNY New Paltz, New Paltz, NY

The 2009 Annual Meeting was hosted on campus by the SUNY New Paltz Geography Department. There were 132 participants, 85 of whom were students. 58 papers and 11 posters were presented in 3 or 4 concurrent sessions for a total of 15 sessions. Students wrote or co-wrote and presented 38 of the conference papers. The keynote speaker was Carol Harden, President of the Association of American Geographers, who presented *Geography and Ecosystems Services: Land, Water and People in the Andes and Appalachians*. The MSDAAG Geography Bowl competition was won by the home team. Many thanks to all participants, and we hope to see you again at West Point in October!

The World Geography Bowl is intended to be a friendly, fast-paced academic competition among college and university students. The game challenges teams of students on fundamental concepts and trivia with geographic themes. Each year, the MSDAAG conducts the division Geography Bowl at its annual regional meeting.

The highest-scoring students are then invited to represent the Middle States Division at the World Geography Bowl Finals at the AAG annual meeting (Seattle in Spring 2011). We invite all division undergraduate and graduate students to compete this fall at the United States Military Academy. Form a team (six people) or sign up this fall to be placed on a team. Standalone Geographers (SAGE)

The AAG has launched an effort to identify standalone geographers (individual geographers and geographers in non-geography departments) and involve more of them in national activities. There are many ways that this networking could benefit geographers working outside of a geography department including: external reviewers for tenure, access to geographic resources, funding for research, and recognition for awards. The AAG has established a standalone geographers' affinity group and will have a reception at the annual meeting. The Middle States' SAGE representative is David Fyfe from York College of PA. He is compiling a network of standalone geographers in the region. There will be a panel session at the MSDAAG in October for those interested in learning more. Middle States Geographer

The Middle States Geographer is the official academic journal of the Middle States Division of the Association of American Geographers. The journal is published annually and includes papers from external submissions and the division Annual Meeting. The Middle States Geographer contains papers authored by both faculty and students (with peer-review by at least two reviewers) and covers a wide range of topics. The journal is presently edited by Kelly Frothingham and Stephen Vermette, Department of Geography and Planning, Buffalo State College.

If you are presenting a paper at the Fall 2010 MSDAAG meeting, we invite you to submit it for publication in the next issue of the Middle States Geographer. Paper submission guidelines are available on the journal's website at <http://geographyplanning.buffalostate.edu/middlestates.html>. You may also contact the editors at frothikm@buffalostate.edu or vermetjs@buffalostate.edu if you are interested in submitting a paper or serving as a reviewer. Students who present a paper at the conference and submit it for publication in the journal have their conference registration refunded.

Presently, Middle States Geographer is entirely an online journal. Articles from 1987 (Volume 20) through 2009 (Volume 42) may be viewed at the journal website. Manuscripts from the 2009 issue (Volume 42) have been recently posted. The online format of the journal widely increases accessibility to readers and exposure for authors, while reducing printing costs. Furthermore, color graphics are now possible at no extra cost to authors. Many thanks to Kelly and Stephen for all their efforts on behalf of the journal.

STUDENT PAPER COMPETITION

All **STUDENTS** are urged to come and present a paper at the fall conference. The reduced rate for enrolled students is \$55.00 before September 10th. MSDAAG also encourages all graduate and undergraduate students to submit and present research papers to the Student Paper Competition. **CASH PRIZES** are awarded. Student status is as of May 1, 2010. Conference fees are returned to students who both submit the completed paper in writing by the deadline and present the paper at the conference. Completed papers must follow the *Middle States Geographer* guidelines and can be no longer than 8 pages, single spaced, 10 point Times Roman or equivalent font. Fall 2010 Meeting – The United States Military Academy, West Point, NY

The 2010 Annual Meeting will be held at the United States Military Academy in West Point NY, in the beautiful Hudson Valley. The conference will be hosted by the United States Military Academy, Department of Geography and Environmental Engineering at the Thayer Hotel on Friday, October 22nd and Saturday, October 23rd.

The United States Military Academy is 50 miles north of New York City. It is located at a significant bend in the Hudson River, which was of strategic importance during the revolutionary war.

West Point Tours schedule frequent tours of the campus to see many of the historic sites (<http://www.westpointtours.com/>). Another noteworthy destination is the West Point Museum (<http://www.usma.edu/museum/>) and the West Point visitor center (<http://www.usma.edu/dcomm/vic.htm>), where tour tickets are available. Reservations for tours are recommended.

The fall 2010 meeting will consist of two days of paper and poster sessions. Friday night will include a hot buffet supper and the Geography Bowl competition. On Saturday, a morning of papers will be followed by a hot buffet luncheon, speaker, and student paper awards. Please join us for this event.

CONFERENCE PARTICIPATION

To participate, please submit an abstract (not exceeding 250 words) by *10 September 2010*. Please note whether your abstract is for a paper, poster, or discussion panel. Please attach your abstract as a WORD file and send to Amy Krakowka at middlestatesmeeting@yahoo.com. To ensure your place on the program, please also fill out the accompanying registration form, enclose a check, and send it to Amy Krakowka, Department of Geography and Environmental Engineering, United States Military Academy, West Point, NY 10996. If you are submitting a paper for the student paper competition, write "Student Paper Submitted" on the lower left side of the check, and it will be refunded. Conference food expenses at the historic Thayer Hotel are VERY high this year, so each student registration fee is being reduced by contributions from the MSDAAG.

MAKE YOUR LODGING RESERVATIONS

The Thayer Hotel is where the conference is located. There are a block of rooms available for \$155 a night. Please make sure you mention the MSDAAG geography conference when making your reservations. Please also reserve your room early; rooms at the conference rate are only available until September 22nd.
