# The 2024 Middle States Division AAG Meeting with AAG support will be held Friday November 1 and Saturday November 2



West Chester University is delighted to host the Middle States Division AAG meeting this year!

The 2024 meeting will take place over two days and will include paper and poster sessions, a keynote presentation, and the Geography Bowl. Friday will include a keynote, paper and poster sessions, dinner, and Geography Bowl. On Saturday, morning sessions will be followed by a buffet luncheon.

### **Transportation and Parking:**

West Chester is accessible from the Philadelphia Airport and by Amtrak via the Exton train station. Parking is available through several garages on campus and student commuter lots are free to park on Saturday.

# **CALL FOR PAPERS, POSTERS AND PANELS**

**Paper Sessions** are typically 60-80 minutes long and consist of three or four presentations of 15 minutes each, plus a question period. Papers on all topics of geographic nature are welcome. Concurrent paper sessions will be held on Friday, November 1 and Saturday, November 2. **Students** who are submitting their papers for the paper competition should consult the guidelines and scoring rubric under the <u>Student Competition</u> tab at <u>https://msaag.aag.org/</u> website for guidance. Competition papers require a faculty letter stating the poster is solely the student/s work. Completed papers should be emailed by **October 11** to MSAAG Student Competition Chair <u>msaag.secretary@gmail.com</u>

**Poster Sessions** will be held on both Friday and Saturday. Students who are submitting their poster competition should send pdfs of their poster to the MSAAG Student Competition chair <u>msaag.secretary@gmail.com</u> by October 11<sup>th</sup> (note that this is earlier than the general conference abstract submission deadline). Consult poster competition guidelines and the judging rubric under the <u>Student Competition</u> tab on the website <u>msaag.aag.org</u> for guidance. Competition posters require a faculty letter stating the poster is solely the student/s work.

Students presenting papers or posters do NOT have to enter the competitions.

**Panel Sessions** are welcome. Panel discussion sessions typically consist of three to four panelists and are organized around a theme. Roundtable discussion sessions are moderated by the chair of the round table who facilitates a discussion among all attendees focusing on a theme or issue. Students are welcome to organize both panel and roundtable sessions. A limited number of panels can be accommodated. **Registration and Abstract Submission** will be managed through the AAG. Registration opens September 1 and Abstract Submission will open September 16<sup>th</sup>. Abstracts will be due by October 18<sup>th</sup>.

Conference registration is online this year at the AAG portal (aag.org). <u>To start the process</u>, you will need to create an AAG account (this does NOT require AAG membership!).

<u>Click here to register</u> starting September 1.

You must register for the meeting before you submit an Abstract.

**Abstract Submission** will open September 16th. The site is still being finalized, and a link will be sent by email when it is available.

# Be sure to submit your paper or poster abstract by October 18. Participants who register for the conference before October 1 will receive an early bird discount.

### **Call for Nominations for MSD Officers**

Please consider joining the leadership of MSAAG. The Executive Board has two meetings a year, one a conference call in the spring and one at the annual fall meeting. We are soliciting nominations for **Secretary/Treasurer** and **Vice President**. The **Secretary/Treasurer** serves a one-year term beginning January 2025. The **Secretary/Treasurer** takes minutes at division meetings, organizes and co-ordinates judging the student paper competition at the fall meeting and reports on the Division's finances, which are handled by AAG. **The Secretary/Treasurer** may run for **Vice President** the following year. The **Vice President** position is a three-year commitment. After serving as Vice President, that person becomes President and then Past President, serving a total of three years to maintain organizational continuity. The **Vice President** organizes the Geography Bowl competition at the fall meeting. The Executive Board will provide all the guidance and resources you need to be successful. The *Middle States Geographer* is the official academic journal of the Middle States Division of the American Association of Geographers. The journal is published annually and includes papers from external submissions and the division Annual Meeting. The Middle States Geographer contains papers authored by both faculty and students (with peer-review by at least two reviewers) and covers a wide range of topics. All Journal Volumes are freely available from the <u>website</u>. We invite all who present papers at the annual Fall MSDAAG meetings to submit a manuscript for publication in the next issue of the *Middle States Geographer*, although manuscripts from all researchers are welcome year-round.

Paper submission guidelines are available on the region's website. You may also contact the editors: Adam Kalkstein at <u>Adam.Kalkstein@westpoint.edu</u> or Paul Marr at Shippensburg University, <u>pgmarr@ship.edu</u> if you have questions about submitting a manuscript or if you are interested in serving as a reviewer. Students presenting papers should consider submitting their paper for publication in the journal and faculty co-authors may be included after the student award competition has occurred. The *Middle States Geographer* is entirely an online journal. Articles from 1968 (Volume 8) through 2022 (Volume 54) may be viewed at the journal website. The 2023 issue (Volume 56) will be available soon. The online format of the journal widely increases accessibility to readers and exposure for authors.,

### Scholarship for Student Geographer from Puerto Rico

The Executive Board has established a \$500 scholarship to encourage participation of a student geographer from Puerto Rico. Applicants should send their scholarship application of no more than 250 words to **Hamil Pearsall** at <u>hamil.pearsall@temple.edu</u> by **September 30.** Applicants should outline briefly their academic/research background and career goals and how participation in the MSAAG meeting will assist in meeting these goals. A nomination letter from a faculty mentor should accompany the student application. The chosen awardee will receive \$500 in funding towards their travel, meals and lodging costs in attending the Middle States Division Annual Meeting. The registration fees for the awardee will also be waived.

# **STUDENT PAPER & POSTER COMPETITION**

## 2024 Annual Meeting Middle States Division of the American Association of Geographers West Chester University, West Chester, PA 1-2 November 2024

Middle States AAG encourages all graduate and undergraduate students to submit and present research papers to the **Student Paper Competition** of the MSDAAG annual conference. The graduate and undergraduate paper competitions have a first prize of \$1000, provided by AAG to fund the awardee's registration and travel costs to the AAG Annual Meeting). The graduate paper second prize is \$300 and the third prize \$150. The undergraduate paper competition has a second prize of \$200 and a third prize of \$100.

There is also a Student Poster Competition with both graduate and undergraduate divisions and first prizes of \$200, second prizes of \$100 and third prizes of \$50. There is a Rob Mason Poster award of \$50 for High School students entering the Poster competition. This award is named after our past Regional Councilor Dr. Robert Mason from Temple University who passed away in 2017. He also served as President, Vice President, Secretary and Treasurer of the Division.

**Submission Guidelines** Student status is as of May 1, 2024. <u>Please note your status</u> (Graduate/Undergraduate) on your abstract and paper submission. <u>Registration fees are refunded after the conference for students both submitting the completed paper by the deadline AND presenting the paper at the conference.</u> Completed papers must follow the *Middle States Geographer* guidelines and can be no longer than 10 pages, single spaced, 10 point Times Roman font, including all figures, tables, endnotes, and references. Further details on the guidelines are specified under the Student Competitions and *Middle States Geographer* tab at <u>msaag.aag.org</u> **Students must have a faculty advisor recommend their entry using the format specified and use the guidelines and rubrics for judging on the website under the tab Student Competitions in preparing their entries.** 

Students should register and submit abstracts through the AAG portal once it is announced on the <u>msaag.aag.org</u> website in September 2024. Students entering the **Student Competition** should email <u>completed papers</u> or <u>pdfs of completed</u> <u>posters</u> to **Kwame Adovor Tsikudo** MSAAG Student Competition Chair at <u>msaag.secretary@gmail.com</u> by **October 11**. Registration fees are refunded for paper/poster competition winners.

### **Geography Bowl Competition**

Calling all students (undergraduate and graduate)! Consider participating in the Middle States Division Geography Bowl at the annual meeting on Friday, November 1 in West Chester, PA. You may form a team beforehand (5-6 people) or sign up at the meeting to be placed on a team. The top six highest-scoring students will be invited to represent the Division at the World Geography Bowl at the AAG annual meeting in April 2024. Students who accept the invitation and represent MSAAG will receive partial funding support to attend the meeting.
